Growing Need



- 91 is primary
 east-west route
- 280,000 vehicles daily, 140,000 more by 2035 (50% increase)
- Afternoon eastbound delays in top 5 in nation – takes 57 mins to travel 21 miles

Fast Facts

- \$1.4 billion project federal, state, local funding
- **16,200 jobs created,** 4,600 construction jobs
- 1,300 employees on site



- First tolled express lanes in Riverside County
- Time savings average
 12 min/day regular lanes;
 78 min/day express lanes

- Bridges: 75% complete
- Concrete paving: 56% complete
- Drainage systems: 54% complete
- Barrier rail: 44% complete



- Overall: Construction more than 60% complete
- Utility relocations: 91% complete
- Excavation: 78% complete
- Structure walls: 66% complete



Express Lanes, Transponders

- Extend **proven** Orange County
 91 Express Lanes operated by OCTA
- RCTC to own/operate 91 Express Lanes in Riverside County
- Seamless transition between counties separate tolls, but single transponder, same account structure, fee schedule, customer service, access policies





Express Lanes, Transponders

- Express lanes will replace carpool lanes; carpoolers with 3+ and transponder ride free 94% of time
- Toll Utility Buildings (TUBs)
 being placed in median for
 enforcement
- Without toll revenue,
 91 widening would not be possible for many years



91 Steer Clear Campaign


- Thank you to community for support during Feb. 19-22

Demolition of West Half of Maple Street Bridge



Remaining Work

Placing 210,000 cubic yards of new pavement

- I-15 paving essentially complete
- Focusing on paving between Serfas Club and County Line
- Long-life pavement (3 layers) designed to last 40 years





- 14 bridges substantially complete
- 18 bridges under construction now
- Largest bridge is flyover connector between I-15 and 91:
 70' tall and 3,700' long







On-Ramps, Off-Ramps

RIVERSIDE COUNTY TRANSPORTATION COMMISSION

Estimate that:

- 1/3 of ramps to be completed by end of spring
- 1/3 of ramps to be completed by end of summer
- 1/3 of ramps to be completed by end of year

All dates/times estimated and subject to change


