#### Call to Order and Self Introductions

The September 20, 2018 meeting of the Annual Eligibility Review subcommittee was called to order by the Chair, Matt McGuinness, at 5:34 p.m. at the Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA) Headquarters, 550 South Main Street in Conference Room 08.

#### **Consent Calendar Items**

#### 1. Approval of March 28, 2018 AER Subcommittee Minutes

A motion was made by Richie Lim, seconded by Eugene Fields, and declared passed by those present, to approve the Annual Eligibility Review subcommittee meeting minutes of March 28, 2018.

#### **Discussion Items**

There were no discussion items.

#### Regular Items

#### 1. Measure M2 Eligibility Overview – Brianna Martinez

Ms. Martinez provided an overview of the Measure M2 Eligibility review process.

#### 2. Pavement Management Plan (PMP) Review – Harry Thomas

- Mr. Thomas provided an overview of the Pavement Management Plan eligibility requirement.
- Mr. Lim asked if the Pavement Condition Index (PCI) is a national index.
- Mr. Thomas replied that if the agency is using StreetSaver or PAVER, then yes. It is also a requirement of federal highway funding that the International Roughness Index be submitted periodically. These two systems are based on American Society for Testing and Materials (ASTM) standards and have about twenty criteria for both asphalt concrete (AC) and Portland cement concrete (PCC) pavements. They are also predictive, unlike the International Roughness Index, so they allow for projections.
- Mr. Soeffner asked if each agency is required to submit the MPAH/Local Report to OCTA.
- Mr. Thomas confirmed that each agency is required to submit the data which is then thoroughly vetted by OCTA.

Mr. Soeffner asked if the inspection report is also sent in after the work is done.



- Mr. Thomas replied that yes, the information goes to a consultant and a statistical analysis is done. This is to help dampen out the subjectivity and produce a reliable standard.
- Mr. McGuinness asked if the agency self-assessment submittals are on an honor system.
- Mr. Thomas replied that the inspectors are consultants—not city employees. The consultants submit most of the data and they are professionals with reputations to maintain.
- Mr. Lim asked if an audit is performed on the consultants' work.
- Mr. Thomas replied that the controls section inspections are reviewed by the city's consultant.
- Mr. McGuinness asked who performs the windshield review and street review.
- Mr. Thomas replied that it is a consultant that does these reviews.
- Mr. Soeffner asked if the agencies use the PMP to create their seven-year plans.
- Mr. Thomas said that the hope is that agencies use the PMP to develop their seven-year plans.
- Mr. Soeffner voiced his concern that because a lot of the cities are now going to district elections, a councilman might support a project in their district, rather than what is best on a citywide basis.
- Mr. Thomas said that the agency is required to run the reports through the software and submit it to OCTA every two years, even though inspections are only required every six years. The software has a deterioration rate built in, so even if an inspection is not completed, if no work is done on the streets then deterioration will show in the system.
- Mr. Soeffner expressed concerns about how the information would be used without safeguards in place.
- Mr. Thomas reiterated that most of the agencies in Orange County have good PCIs.
- Mr. Lim asked why inspections are required every six years instead of every two.
- Mr. Thomas replied that it is every six years to accommodate budget and time restraints. The timeframe also syncs with the typical maintenance plan of most local jurisdictions.
- Mr. Thomas provided other examples of why the six-year inspection cycle makes sense for the program.
- Mr. McGuinness asked if Main Street is an MPAH or a local street.
- Mr. Alcock stated that it is an MPAH street and noted that classifications are based on average daily traffic volumes.
- Mr. Thomas stated that state highways and freeways are not included in the PMP, except for Laguna Beach since they do not have any other streets that would qualify them for M2 funds.

Mr. Lim asked about the sample size.



- Mr. Thomas said that 10% of the street or MPAH facility is inspected, and noted that representative sections should be selected.
- Mr. Lim reiterated that the purpose of the AER Subcommittee is to ensure that the agency meets the reporting requirement, regardless of the PCI rating the agencies are reporting.
- Mr. Thomas stated that based on the past two submittals, no agencies are below the fair range.
- Mr. Fields asked Mr. Thomas to elaborate on Laguna Woods since most of their local streets are private.
- Mr. Thomas replied that agencies don't report on private streets.
- Mr. Lim stated that his understanding of the seven-year projected PCI is that it is based on the projected amount of funds that will be budgeted or expended during the seven years to meet the required reconstruction, rehabilitation, and preventative maintenance.
- Mr. Thomas said that OCTA has three scenarios the agencies are required to model. One is a sevenyear projection based on current budget levels, assuming they continue for the seven years.
- Mr. Lim asked what assumption is used to extrapolate out seven years.
- Mr. Thomas said that the approved software reflects the proposed improvements and models based on the input from the agency.
- Mr. Lim asked if the formula that is used to extrapolate the data gets updated.
- Mr. Thomas confirmed that the algorithms are updated. If an agency has enough data, it is possible to do a custom algorithm. The University of Colorado is the sponsor for PAVER and the Metropolitan Transportation Commission sponsors StreetSaver.
- Mr. Fields asked if there is a difference in cost between the two software systems.
- Mr. Thomas said the training for PAVER is in Arizona and costs \$1,000 for a one-week session. StreetSaver does user group seminars in the north and south that are a nominal cost to attend. OCTA provides training for the County.
- Mr. Kaplan asked how many different consultants there are in Orange County.
- Mr. Thomas said that there are currently six consultants preparing plans and eleven that are prequalified.
- Mr. Lim asked about the assumptions for the projections in regard to Garden Grove. Their projections from two years ago were higher than they are during this submittal.
- Mr. Thomas said the problem is that they are not be putting enough funding in the projection to maintain the PCI or improve it.
- Mr. Fields commented that this is similar to what happened in Placentia several years ago. They do course corrections to offset budget deficits.



Mr. Thomas said Senate Bill 1 may be factored into some of the future projections.

A motion was made by Richie Lim to accept the PMP eligibility review as complete, seconded by Dale Soeffner, and declared passed by those present.

The recommendation was approved with no further discussion.

#### 3. Eligibility Review Next Steps – Brianna Martinez

Ms. Martinez asked the members to complete the review forms and return signed forms to OCTA by October 1, 2018. Ms. Martinez also informed the subcommittee that AER subcommittee recommendations will be presented to the TOC on October 9, 2018. Ms. Martinez stated that the eligibility findings are scheduled to be presented to the OCTA Regional Planning & Highways (RP&H) Committee on December 3, 2018 and Board of Directors on December 10, 2018.

Mr. Fields recommended a positive letter be sent to Fullerton, and asked staff to draft the letter and send out once approved by the OCTA Board of Directors.

### **Ordinance Excerpts**

and phasing of capital, operations and maintenance of the street routes and traffic signals; and include information on how the street routes and traffic signals may be synchronized with traffic signals on the street routes in adjoining jurisdictions. The Local Traffic Signal Synchronization Plan shall be consistent with the Traffic Signal Synchronization Master Plan.

- 7. Pavement Management Plan. Adopt and update biennially a Pavement Management Plan, and issue, using a common format approved by the Authority, a report every two years regarding the status of road pavement conditions and implementation of the Pavement Management Plan.
- a. Authority, in consultation with the Eligible Jurisdictions, shall define a countywide management method to inventory, analyze and evaluate road pavement conditions, and a common method to measure improvement of road pavement conditions.
- b. The Pavement Management Plan shall be based on: either the Authority's countywide pavement management method or a comparable management method approved by the Authority, and the Authority's method to measure improvement of road pavement conditions.
  - c. The Pavement Management Plan shall include:
    - (i) Current status of pavement on roads;
- (ii) A six-year plan for road maintenance and rehabilitation, including projects and funding;
- (iii) The projected road pavement conditions resulting from the maintenance and rehabilitation plan; and
- (iv) Alternative strategies and costs necessary to improve road pavement conditions.
- 8. Expenditure Report. Adopt an annual Expenditure Report to account for Net Revenues, developer/traffic impact fees, and funds expended by the Eligible Jurisdiction which satisfy the Maintenance of Effort requirements. The Expenditure

Report shall be submitted by the end of six (6) months following the end of the jurisdiction's fiscal year and include the following:

- a. All Net Revenue fund balances and interest earned.
- b. Expenditures identified by type (i.e., capital, operations,

administration, etc.), and program or project.

- 9. Project Final Report. Provide Authority with a Project Final Report within six months following completion of a project funded with Net Revenues.
  - 10. Time Limits for Use of Net Revenues.
- a. Agree that Net Revenues for Regional Capacity Program projects and Regional Traffic Signal Synchronization Program projects shall be expended or encumbered no later than the end of the fiscal year for which the Net Revenues are programmed. A request for extension of the encumbrance deadline for no more than twenty-four months may be submitted to the Authority no less than ninety days prior to the deadline. The Authority may approve one or more requests for extension of the encumbrance deadline.
- b. Agree that Net Revenues allocated for any program or project, other than a Regional Capacity Program project or a Regional Traffic Signal Synchronization Program project, shall be expended or encumbered within three years of receipt. The Authority may grant an extension to the three-year limit, but extensions shall not be granted beyond a total of five years from the date of the initial funding allocation.
- c. In the event the time limits for use of Net Revenues are not satisfied then any retained Net Revenues that were allocated to an Eligible Jurisdiction and interest earned thereon shall be returned to the Authority and these Net Revenues and interest earned thereon shall be available for allocation to any project within the same source program.
- 11. Maintenance of Effort. Annual certification that the Maintenance of Effort requirements of Section 6 of the Ordinance have been satisfied.
  - 12. No Supplanting of Funds. Agree that Net Revenues shall not be

separate allocations, shall be defined as "Net Revenues" and shall be allocated solely for the transportation purposes described in the Ordinance.

#### **SECTION 5. BONDING AUTHORITY**

"Pay as you go" financing is the preferred method of financing transportation improvements and operations under the Ordinance. However, the Authority may use bond financing as an alternative method if the scope of planned expenditures makes "pay as you go" financing unfeasible. Following approval by the electors of the ballot proposition authorizing imposition of the transactions and use tax and authorizing issuance of bonds payable from the proceeds of the tax, bonds may be issued by the Authority pursuant to Division 19 of the Public Utilities Code, at any time before, on, or after the imposition of taxes, and from time to time, payable from the proceeds of the tax and secured by a pledge of revenues from the proceeds of the tax, in order to finance and refinance improvements authorized by the Ordinance.

#### SECTION 6. MAINTENANCE OF EFFORT REQUIREMENTS

It is the intent of the Legislature and the Authority that the Net Revenues allocated to a jurisdiction pursuant to the Ordinance for street and road projects shall be used to supplement existing local discretionary funds being used for transportation improvements. Each jurisdiction is hereby required to annually maintain as a minimum no less than the maintenance of effort amount of local discretionary funds required to be expended by the jurisdiction for local street and road purposes pursuant to the current Ordinance No. 2 for Fiscal Year 2010-2011. The maintenance of effort level for each jurisdiction as determined through this process shall be adjusted effective July 1, 2014 and every three fiscal years thereafter in an amount equal to the percentage change for the Construction Cost Index compiled by Caltrans for the immediately preceding three calendar years, providing that any percentage increase in the maintenance of effort level based on this adjustment shall not exceed the percentage increase in the growth rate in the jurisdiction's general fund revenues over the same time period. The Authority shall not allocate any Net Revenues to any jurisdiction for any fiscal year until that jurisdiction has certified to the Authority that it

has included in its budget for that fiscal year an amount of local discretionary funds for streets and roads purposes at least equal to the level of its maintenance of effort requirement. An annual independent audit may be conducted by the Authority to verify that the maintenance of effort requirements are being met by the jurisdiction. Any Net Revenues not allocated pursuant to the maintenance of effort requirement shall be allocated to the remaining eligible jurisdictions according to the formula described in the Ordinance.

#### **SECTION 7. ADMINISTRATION**

The Authority shall allocate Revenues to fund facilities, services and projects as specified in the Ordinance, and shall administer the Ordinance consistent with the authority cited. Revenues may be expended by the Authority for salaries, wages, benefits, and overhead and for those services, including contractual services, necessary to carry out its responsibilities pursuant to Division 19; however, in no case shall the Revenues expended for salaries and benefits of Authority administrative staff exceed more than one percent (1%) of the Revenues in any year. The Authority shall use, to the extent possible, existing state, regional and local transportation planning and programming data and expertise, and may, as the law permits, contract with any public agency or private firm for services necessary to carry out the purposes of the Ordinance. Expenses incurred by the Authority for administrative staff and for project implementation, including contracting with public agencies and private firms, shall be identified in the annual report prepared pursuant to Section 10, subpart 8, of the Ordinance.

#### SECTION 8. ANNUAL APPROPRIATIONS LIMIT

The annual appropriations limit established pursuant to Article XIII. B. of the California Constitution and Section 180202 of the Public Utilities Code shall be established as \$1,123 million for the 2006-07 fiscal year. The appropriations limit shall be subject to adjustment as provided by law. All expenditures of the Revenues are subject to the appropriations limit of the Authority.

- Maintenance of traffic signal equipment, coordination and timing on the city streets, as well as the city's share of such expenditures covering traffic signals situated at intersections of city streets and state highways within the incorporated area of the city.
- Salaries and expenses of employees in connection with maintenance and/or operations (direct costs).

## A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF ALISO VIEJO CONCERNING THE MEASURE M2 EXPENDITURE REPORT FOR THE CITY OF ALISO VIEJO

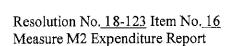

The City Council of the City of Rancho Santa Margarita, California, hereby finds, determines, declares, and resolves as follows:

WHEREAS, on November 7, 2006, Orange County voters approved Ordinance No. 3, the Renewed Measure M ("M2") multi-billion dollar program extension of the original Measure M; and

WHEREAS, the City of Rancho Santa Margarita seeks to establish eligibility to receive an apportionment of M2 sales tax revenues, which can be used to fund transportation-related projects and programs; and

WHEREAS, Local Transportation Authority Ordinance No. 3 requires jurisdictions to adopt an annual Expenditure Report to account for Net Revenues, developer/traffic impact fees, and funds expended by the City of Rancho Santa Margarita which satisfy the Maintenance of Effort requirements; and

WHEREAS, the Expenditure Report shall include all Net Revenue fund balances, interest earned and expenditures identified by type and program or project; and

WHEREAS, the Expenditure Report must be approved and submitted to the Orange County Transportation Authority each year within six months or the end of the local jurisdiction's fiscal year to be eligible to receive Net Revenues as part of Measure M2.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF RANCHO SANTA MARGARITA, CALIFORNIA, DOES RESOLVE, DECLARE, DETERMINE, AND ORDER AS FOLLOWS:

<u>SECTION 1.</u> The M2 Expenditure Report attached hereto as Exhibit 1 and incorporated herein by this reference, is in conformance with the M2 Expenditure Report Template provided in the Renewed Measure M Eligibility Guidelines and accounts for Net Revenues including interest earned, expenditures during the fiscal year, and balances at the end of the fiscal year.

<u>SECTION 2.</u> That the City Council of Rancho Santa Margarita hereby approves the City of Rancho Santa Margarita annual M2 Expenditure Report attached hereto as Exhibit 1 and incorporated herein by this reference, in conformance with the M2 requirements.

The beginning balance for the Regional Traffic Signal Synchronization Program has been modified to reflect the reallocation of \$17,895 of project costs that were previously reported as M2 expenditures in Fiscal Year 2015-16. These project costs were funded from another funding source.

The beginning balance for the Senior Mobility Program was modified to include \$130 for interest that was allocated to the program during Fiscal Year 2016-17 but not reported on the M2 Annual Expenditure Report for the Fiscal Year Ended June 30, 2017.

In Fiscal Year 2017-18, M2 Fairshare expenditures exceeded available M2 Fairshare funding, creating a negative cash balance in the City's Measure M Fund (where the M2 Fairshare program is recorded). This negative cash balance will be restored in Fiscal Year 2018-19 from M2 Fairshare funds to be received that year. However, since a negative cash balance under generally accepted accounting principles (GAAP) is effectively a borrowing from the other City funds that participate in the City's checking account, on December 5, 2017, the City Council acknowledged and authorized this temporary interfund borrowing by approving a \$436,277 loan from the City's Capistrano Circulation Fee Program Fund to the City's Measure M Fund. The negative cash balance and the associated implied interfund borrowing will be eliminated in Fiscal Year 2018-19 upon receipt of the M2 Fairshare program revenues to be received that year.

- <u>Section 3.</u> The City Council adopts the FY 2017/18 Measure M2 Expenditure Report, and directs the Executive Director of the Public Works Agency, or his or her designee, to submit the Expenditure Report to the Orange County Transportation Authority.
- <u>Section 4.</u> This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its adoption by the City Council, and the Clerk of the Council shall attest to and certify the vote adopting this Resolution.
