The meeting was called to order by Mr. Wheeler at 1:30 p.m. and self-introductions were made.

#### **CONSENT CALENDAR ITEMS**

#### 1. Approval of Minutes

Mr. Stack motioned to approve the minutes.

Mr. Youssef seconded the motion.

The Minutes were approved with no further discussion.

#### **REGULAR ITEMS**

2. 2020 Comprehensive Transportation Funding Programs (CTFP) Guidelines Update – Joseph Alcock

Mr. Alcock presented proposed revisions to the Measure M (M2) Comprehensive Transportation Funding Programs (CTFP) Guidelines for the 2021 O and P call for projects (call).

Mr. Alcock stated that for Project O, staff was recommending clarifications which included more accurately depicting the project development process, updating the sustainability scoring criteria, clarifying grading language, and revising the call amount from \$32 million to \$22 million, due to economic impacts associated with the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic.

Mr. Alcock then introduced Ms. Yang to the TSC and she presented staff's rationale for proposed changes to the Project P CTFP call guidelines.

Ms. Yang noted that staff's intent in making the recommended changes was to focus in on the program's original intent, which was to fund regional traffic signal synchronization projects, which could be completed in a relatively short period of time. Ms. Yang then stated that OCTA was not recommending the elimination of any previously eligible capital improvements. She also noted that the proposed changes were made to clarify sections, consolidate text throughout the chapter, and place more of an emphasis on comprehensive and tangible improvements designed to enhance the operations of regional corridors.





Ms. Khan then inquired if for Project O, if there had been any consideration of making grading outside of a roadway's footprint eligible for M2 reimbursement.

Mr. Alcock replied that grading outside of the roadway right-of-way, if it is directly required to complete the Master Plan of Arterial Highways (MPAH) improvement and is not a developer obligation, would likely be eligible, but would need to be evaluated on a case-by-case basis.

Ms. Khan noted that in some cases, projects require grading to go outside of the MPAH footprint. She stated the County had had a couple of these types of the projects in the past and they resulted in M2 reimbursement challenges. She also noted that she anticipated issues like this to come up again in the future for some of the County's projects.

Mr. Wheeler stated that he recalled that the City of Lake Forest had once experienced a similar issue and noted that the issue, as he understood was reviewed on a case-by-case basis by OCTA.

Mr. Mortazavi asked for further clarification on the County's question.

Ms. Khan stated that her question was related to the eligibility of potentially grading outside of a roadway's footprint, if it is required to complete an MPAH project.

Next Mr. Sinacori inquired if there would be flexibility with respect to traffic data collection requirements, due to the COVID-19 pandemic.

Mr. Alcock stated that this is something OCTA could look into. However, he noted that it would be difficult to recommend a policy change given that both the extent and length of COVID-19 impacts is unknown.

Mr. Sinacori suggested that they could collect data and apply factors to traffic volumes based upon historic trends but noted that the City was open to other suggestions.

Mr. Alcock stated that this is an emerging issue, which OCTA would need to track and would need to address with the Technical Steering Committee (TSC) and Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) in the future, if the impacts of COVD-19 become more pronounced.

Next, Mr. Wheeler asked why the offset intersection definition was changed in the guidelines, and asked if the change meant that funds applied toward them would come from the \$75,000 max.





Mr. Alcock stated the offset signal definition change was done with regard to Project P only and was intended to incentivize signal timing benefits versus more capital-intensive improvements.

Ms. Yang added that in terms of intersection counts that they did not apply to the max and clarified that \$75,000 was for signals along the corridor. She then noted that for offset signals, they are included if there is enough budget in the cap to include them, as they are typically affected by timing done in the corridor.

There was no further discussion.

A motion was made by Ms. Khan, seconded by Mr. Youssef, and was approved with no further discussion.

#### **DISCUSSION ITEMS**

## 3. Measure M (M2) Maintenance of Effort (MOE) Update Discussion - Kurt Brotcke

Mr. Brotcke stated that staff was currently in the process of working with its Board of Directors (Board) to amend the Measure M (M2) Ordinance. He stated that the staff recommendation would be to modify M2 MOE benchmark requirements for fiscal year 2019-20 and fiscal year 2020-21, in order to address anticipated near-term negative growth in general fund revenues due to the COVID-19 pandemic. He further stated that as part of this process, OCTA would be required to notify local agencies, issue public notification, and also conduct a public hearing prior to the adoption of the proposed amendment.

Mr. Wheeler inquired if there had been any opposition to the proposal.

Mr. Brotcke replied in the negative.

Mr. Emami asked if OCTA was aware of any adjustments to dates or requirements for MOE under Senate Bill 1 (SB1).

Mr. Brotcke stated that he was not, but acknowledged that the California State Association of Counties and other agencies were asking similar questions.

Mr. Sethuraman stated the City of Costa Mesa's SB1 MOE requirement is lower than its M2 MOE benchmark requirement and noted that the City was hopping they could use their state SB1 MOE benchmark to satisfy the M2 requirement. Mr. Sethuraman also asked if there was a way local agencies could make up MOE expenditures in subsequent fiscal years.





Mr. Stack inquired if the proportionality option being evaluated by OCTA in fiscal year 2020-2021, was derived from the percent of general fund revenue reduction that is anticipated due to the pandemic.

Mr. Brotcke stated that as part of the Board staff report, there was a table available which showed each agencies' MOE percentage as a proportion of their 2018-2019 general fund revenues. Mr. Brotcke also noted that these proportions were based upon fiscal year 2020-2021 MOE benchmarks.

Ms. Cardoso added that OCTA did an MOE benchmark adjustment in April which was already applied. As such, she noted that the most appropriate proportional calculation involved taking the existing MOE benchmark and comparing it to 2018-2019 general fund revenues.

# Comprehensive Transportation Funding Programs – 2021 Call for Projects Technical Consideration

#### Overview

Orange County Transportation Authority staff has been reviewing 2021 Comprehensive Transportation Funding Programs call for projects applications. While engaged in this process, an issue relating to current traffic count requirements has emerged and technical consideration options are presented for Technical Steering Committee input and direction.

#### Recommendation

Provide direction to staff on the technical consideration options presented in this report.

#### **Background**

In August, 2020, the Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA) Board of Directors (Board) authorized the 2021 Measure M2 Comprehensive Transportation Funding Programs (CTFP) – Regional Capacity Program (Project O) and Regional Traffic Signal Synchronization Program (Project P) call for projects (Call). The Board made available \$22 million in M2 funds to support the Project O call and \$8 million to support the Project P call.

Applications were due to OCTA this past fall and since that time staff has been working with local agencies to review and ensure compliance with CTFP Guidelines requirements, which were approved by the OCTA Technical Steering Committee (TSC), Technical Advisory Committee (TAC), and OCTA Board of Directors (Boards) last summer.

During this process, staff has found that some applications, which submitted traffic count information consistent with Project O current traffic count requirements have been unable to document sufficient congestion to qualify for

M2 funding consideration, on what were previously known and documented congested facilities.

In working with local agencies to understand this issue, it has become clear that this trend is the result of local agencies having taken traffic counts during the coronavirus (COVID-19) pandemic, rather than the emergence of long-term congestion reduction on these facilities. Therefore, given this finding, staff is offering the following options (provided below) for TSC discussion and guidance/recommendation.

#### **Discussion**

#### **Technical Consideration Options**

Option 1: No change. Impacted applications would be determined to be ineligible to compete in the call, if current traffic counts do not document a vehicle to capacity (V/C) ratio of .71 or worse, even if the traffic counts were conducted during the pandemic.

Option 2: Allow local agencies to use traffic counts outside of the CTFP Guidelines "current" traffic count requirement, through a specified time period, so counts are still generally current, possibly up to six years.

Option 3: Allow local agencies to propose a rationale for providing different traffic count figures, which takes into account recent changes in conditions.

It should be noted that with respect to Options 2 and 3, this flexibility, if approved, will likely alter final Project O scoring. Further, it is recommended that this flexibility only be granted to local agencies which can clearly document that the facility/ies being applied for had a V/C of .71 or worse at a previous point in time (based upon a previous traffic analysis), and that currently documented low traffic volumes are the result of the COVID-19 pandemic. If these conditions cannot be satisfied, then this flexibility, if approved, would not be provided.

#### Next Steps

If the TSC selects a preferred technical consideration option to address this issue, that option will then be advanced to the TAC for further review and consideration. If the TAC also approves, then the recommended option will be used by staff to complete final application scoring and programming recommendations. The funding award recommendations are anticipated to be presented to the TSC and TAC in March and to the OCTA Regional Planning & Highways Committee and Board of Directors for final approval in May.

#### **Summary**

Three technical consideration options to address an issue which emerged, relating to current traffic count requirements in the Project O Program are presented for TSC review, consideration, and direction.
