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FUNDING: OC Go and state funds




OCTA reconstructed Lakeview Avenue as a bridge to allow vehicles to pass over the Burlington Northern Santa Fe Railway. As part of the project, Lakeview Avenue was raised to separate car traffic from train traffic. The overpass was built from approximately 200 feet south of Orchard Drive to 150 feet south of Eisenhower Circle. The Lakeview Avenue overcrossing is one of the seven grade separations within the OC Bridges Program.

This project was funded by OC Go (also known as Measure M), a 30-year half-cent sales tax for transportation improvements in Orange County through 2041. After experiencing the success and progress of M1, nearly 71% of Orange County voters renewed the half-cent sales tax for transportation improvements to launch OC Go in 2011. In addition to OC Go funding, this project received funding from state sources.
