## Background

Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA) Measure M2 (M2)

**Project S: Transit Extensions To Metrolink** 

- Approved by the voters in 2006
- Partnership between OCTA and local agencies
- Extend the reach of Metrolink
- Foster local transit connectivity
- Competitive process to identify meritorious projects for funding consideration
- Santa Ana/Garden Grove (SA/GG) Fixed-Guideway
  - Step I Initial Needs Assessment completed in 2007
  - Alternatives Analysis (AA) and environmental clearance began in Fall 2009
  - OCTA programmed funding for additional preliminary engineering (PE) in November 2010





**Corridor:**Santa Ana Regional Transportation Center to Harbor Boulevard/Westminster Avenue

**Length:** 8.2 – 8.5 track miles

Number of stations: 21-22 stations Fleet size: 6-7 vehicles

Peak/Off-Peak headways: 10 minutes /15 minutes

**Projected Fixed-Guideway Ridership:** 4,700-6,000 daily boardings
