



Pacific Electric Right-of-Way/ West Santa Ana Branch Corridor Alternatives Analysis

Impetus for Study

- Study arose during the 2008 Regional Transportation Plan development
- SCAG Transportation Committee requested an alternatives analysis to determine appropriate use of right-of-way (ROW)
- Chief Executive Officers of SCAG, MTA, and OCTA agreed to work cooperatively on study
- AECOM, Inc., to provide consultant assistance
- Opportunity to improve inter-county travel and transit accessibility, and support regional goals

Federal Transit Administration – New Starts Alternatives Analysis

- Outcome: Locally preferred alternative
- Four Key Steps:
 - 1) Study initiation
 - 2) Alternatives development and refinement
 - 3) Alternatives evaluation
 - 4) Selection of locally preferred alternative

Range of Alternatives to be Considered

- No-build alternative
- Transportation systems management alternative
 - Baseline against which build alternatives are compared
- Build alternatives
 - Bus rapid transit (BRT)
 - Light rail transit (LRT)
 - Commuter rail
 - High-speed rail









Public and Stakeholder Involvement

- Inter-agency staff coordination
- Briefings with elected officials
- Technical Advisory Committee and Steering Committee
- Three rounds of public workshops at key milestones
- Environmental justice considerations

Related Studies and Projects Santa Ana-Garden Grove Fixed Guideway Study

- Go Local transit connection to Metrolink
- SARTC to Garden Grove
- Would traverse
 PE ROW between
 Harbor Boulevard and
 Raitt Street
- Study to conclude in fall 2011

Related Studies and Activities Central County Corridor Major Investment Study

- Identifies need for congestion relief between Orange Crush and downtown Santa Ana
- Multi-modal strategies include:
 - Santa Ana Garden Grove Fixed Guideway
 - SR-22 ramp connectors to PE ROW
- Study will conclude in summer 2010
