- Measure M2 (OC Go) approved November 2006
- Innovative Freeway Environmental Mitigation Program (EMP)
 - Offsets biological impacts of 13 OC Go freeway projects
 - Purchase of conservation lands (Preserves)
 - Provide funding for habitat restoration
- Approximately 5% of the OC Go freeway program revenue



CCTA Preserves and Restoration Projects




- Seven Preserves acquired as permanent open space
 - 1,300 acres
- 11 restoration projects
 - 350 acres
 - native habitat
- 1 dam removal project

 - State and federal regulatory agencies




Conservation Plan Annual Report Overview

 - 8 different regional coordination and collaboration groups








- \$34.5 million Endowment Contribution
 - Fund long-term Preserve management
 - Approved by OCTA Board of Directors
- Phase 1: Endowment funding
 - Deposit ~\$3 million/yr. (10-12 yrs.)
- Phase 2: Determine Single or Multiple Entities to Manage Endowment
- Balance as of March 31, 2019: \$9,263,521.79
