Program Highlights - Freeways



In Year Nine of 30-year M2 Program;


- 12 of the 30 freeway segments are complete \$697 million
- Three in construction and another three on the way \$2.5 billion*
- Remaining 12 in project development \$1.9 billion
- 77,000 motorist assists by the Freeway Service Patrol



4th Quarter Freeway Highlights



- I-5 central project: construction continues
- I-5 south project: ground breaking event was held on June 6th
 - Oso Parkway to Alicia Parkway: in construction
 - SR-73 to Oso Parkway: construction package readied
 - Alicia Parkway to El Toro Road: final design completed
- I-405 project: bridge work continues
 - Slater Avenue bridge first to open August 29, 2019
 - Construction staging under review



Program Highlights - Streets and Roads occo



Approximately \$777 million provided to local jurisdictions to date:

- 139 street capacity improvement projects
- 108 signal synchronization projects
- Nearly \$400 million in flexible funding

4th Quarter Highlights

- Recommendations for Regional Capacity Program and Regional Traffic Signal Synchronization Program approved by the Board on June 10, 2019
- Status report on M2 grant-funded projects presented to the Board on June 10, 2019





Program Highlights - Transit



- \$182 million used to fund Metrolink service to Orange County
- \$476 million invested in station and grade crossing improvements
 - 54 daily trains responsible for 5.1 million annual boardings
- OC's first modern streetcar underway; expanding the reach of commuter rail and augmenting bus transit
- 19 community-based transit/circulators in operation
- \$2 million allocated to improve 79 heavily used bus stops
- \$69 million allocated to expand mobility choices for seniors and persons with disabilities

4th Quarter Transit Highlights



- Fullerton Transportation Elevator Upgrades: construction completed May 1, 2019
- OC Streetcar: Construction commenced on the western half of the alignment. Preliminary design review of vehicles completed
- Safe Transit Stops: new programming recommendations approved by the Board on June 24, 2019, at 36 locations





Program Highlights - Environmental



Environmental Cleanup Program

- \$47 million allocated for 178 water quality improvement projects
 - 15,000+ filters installed resulting in 2,600 40-foot shipping containers of trash captured to date

Freeway Environmental Mitigation Program

- 1,300 acres of open space preserved and 350 acres restored
- Receipt of biological and water quality permits streamlining freeway projects
- Endowment established to protect acquired lands in perpetuity. Annual deposit was made in July 2019







4th Quarter Environmental Highlights



- Ninth water quality call for projects released in March
- Programming recommendations planned for September 9, 2019







Program Outlook



- City of Stanton and City of Santa Ana re-eligibility
- Market trends indicating higher construction costs
- Coordination with SB 1 projects (Chapter 5, Statutes of 2017)
- Challenges with projects in environmental and construction phase
