## **OCTA's State and Federal Calls for Projects Database**

Starting with the 2019 Call for Projects, **online applications** were accepted for submittal through the OCTA State and Federal Calls for Projects Database (Database).

Similarly, starting with the 2019 Call for Projects, **online semi-annual reports** will be accepted through the Database.

Projects that were awarded through the BCIP in 2012, 2014, or 2016 will be able to submit their semi-annual reports by submitting the form available on the OCTA BCIP webpage to OCTA through email. Local agencies interested in submitting semi-annual reports for BCIP projects awarded prior to 2019 through the Database, should contact BCIP staff to add these projects to the Database library.

For the first year, of semi-annual reporting through the Database, agencies will be able to continue to submit reports through email. However, after the first year this option will no longer be accepted.

**This document provides instructions for how to submit semiannual reports through the OCTA State and Federal Calls for Projects Database.**

### **Reporting Requirements**

Projects awarded through the BCIP are required to submit semiannual progress reports to OCTA every six months.

The reporting schedule for all BCIP Calls for Project years is available on the OCTA BCIP Webpage:

2019 BCIP projects are required to submit reports in March and September of each year until project completion.

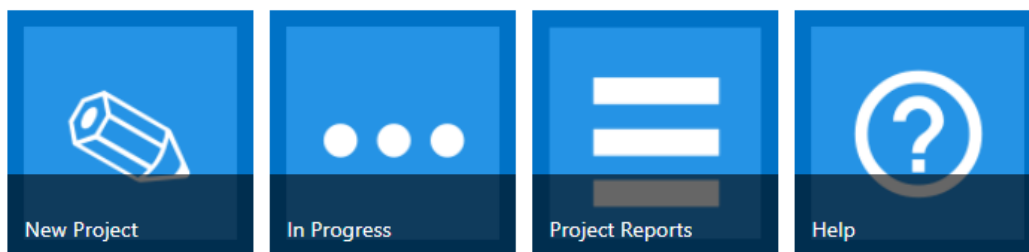

**Contents of the report include:**

Reporting Area	Description
<b>Schedule</b>	<p>The schedule as completed in the initial project application will autofill in the “Original Completion Date” column.</p> <p>When filling in the current completion dates in the schedule information please be mindful of the following due dates:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Environmental should be submitted to Caltrans by November 1 of the year programmed (For phases beyond Environmental)</li> <li>• Request for Authorization to Proceed (E-76) should be submitted to Caltrans and copied to OCTA by February 1 of the year programmed</li> </ul>

	<p>Any schedule changes that would delay the program year need to be approved by the OCTA Board. Programming changes to the BCIP are presented to the Board in June and December of each year. Please coordinate with BCIP staff if there is an anticipated programming change.</p> <p>Additionally, staff is aware that each project will use the schedule area as applicable. Please feel free to reach out to BCIP staff with questions.</p>
<b>Funding</b>	<p>Planned Obligation - Funding as approved by OCTA Board</p> <p>Current Estimates - To account for any cost changes after obligation.</p> <p><b>The local agencies are responsible for cost increases, meaning that CMAQ will not cover any cost increases.</b></p> <p>Actual Expended - The amount that has already been invoiced and reimbursed by FHWA via Caltrans for the project.</p> <p>Remaining Allocation – Funding that has not yet been reimbursed by FHWA via Caltrans.</p>
<b>Major Activities</b>	In the past six months. Start or completion of phases, E-76 submittals, contract award, etc.
<b>Status</b>	What phase is the project in currently? Upcoming activities in the next six months?
<b>Issues and Resolution</b>	Please describe. Anticipated need for time extensions, scope change, etc.
<b>OCTA Authorized Funding History</b>	Any OCTA approvals that impact the funding. This will typically consist of the initial Funding Approval action, and subsequent State and Federal Programming Updates if applicable.
<b>Contact</b>	Project manager or other contact person for the project. This contact will receive confirmation emails indicating when reports are submitted.
<b>Attachments</b>	May include associated staff reports, SCAQMD Air Quality Analysis, and cooperative agreement, etc.

**Save As Draft** – Allows the Form to be saved to resume work later.

**Submit** – The form will be transmitted to OCTA. Agencies will receive a confirmation email indicating that the report has been submitted.

**Reminders:**

- Please save a copy of the reports for your own records prior to submittal.
- Ensure to keep the project contact information current at the time of submittal
- OCTA staff may reach out to clarify any information included in the submitted report.
