

OCTA staff has been working with the United States Army Corps of Engineers to develop a programmatic permitting process that fits the M2 freeway program. The strategy developed with this innovative program is to obtain advanced mitigation credit to utilize the NCCP/HCP mitigation as well as develop an acceptable streamlined permit process to occur at the M2 freeway project level.

5. NCCP/HCP and Draft EIR/EIS Update Dan Phu, OCTA

The comment period for the OCTA Natural Community Conservation Plan/Habitat Conservation Plan (NCCP/HCP) and Draft Environmental Impact Report/Statement (EIR/EIS) concluded in February 2015. Staff is working with the wildlife agencies to finalize these documents which include responding to comments received related to the

NCCP/HCP as well as the Draft EIR/EIS. There were a number of comments that pertained to public access and these are being considered in the development of the Resource Management Plan. Concurrently, the wildlife agencies are working on their biological findings which is part of the process that results in the issuance of the biological resources permits. Similar to the process that was undertaken prior to the release of the Draft NCCP/HCP and EIR/EIS, these documents will go through an administrative review process by the wildlife agencies. The final NCCP/HCP and EIR/EIS are anticipated to be completed by the end of 2015.

6. Resource Management Plan Update

Staff anticipates the public release of separate Preserve specific Resource Management Plans (RMP's) for the five properties covered in the NCCP/HCP within Trabuco and Silverado Canyons to occur in summer/fall 2015. These five Preserves include: Ferber Ranch, Hafen, Saddle Creek South, O'Neill Oaks, and MacPherson. The RMP's will determine the appropriate management needs (consistent with the NCCP/HCP) of each of the Preserves. The remaining two properties (Hayashi and Aliso Canyon) will be released once biological surveys have been conducted and will follow a similar process. As previously mentioned, all collected input related to public access is being considered in the development of the RMPs.
