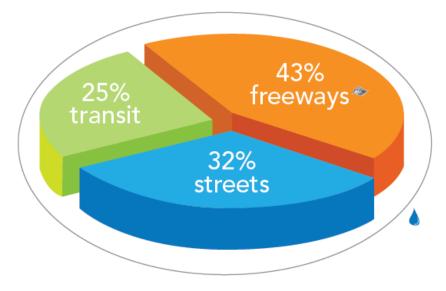

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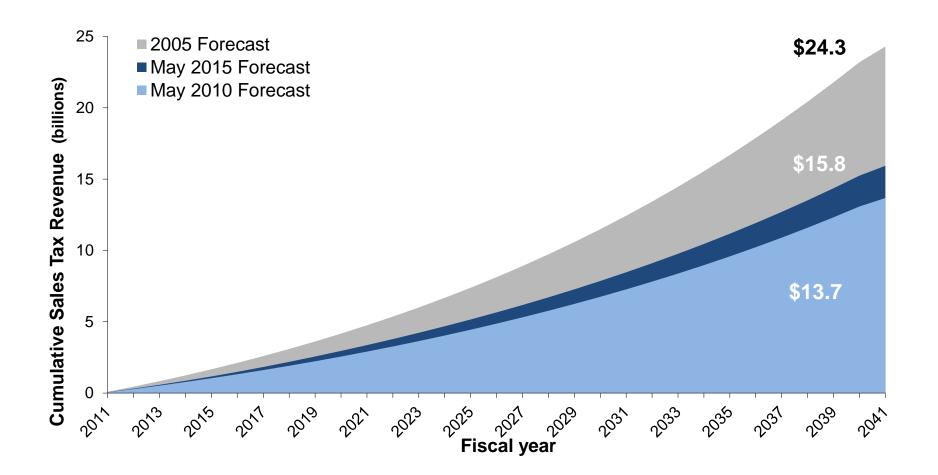

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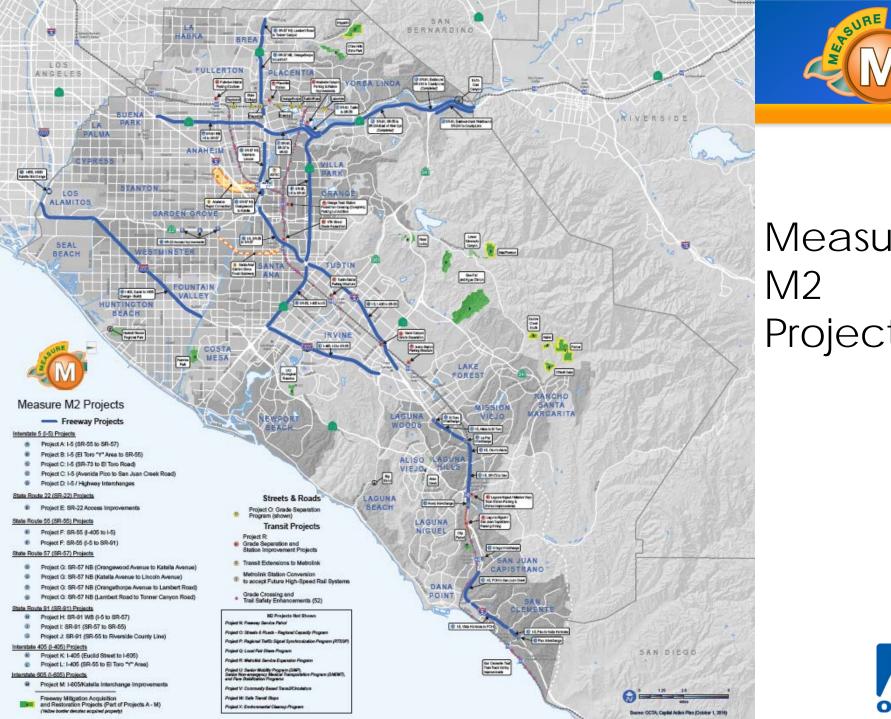

At least every ten years the Authority shall conduct a comprehensive review of all projects and programs implemented under the Plan to evaluate the performance of the overall program and may revise the Plan to improve its performance.

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## Five Objectives



- 1. Research and identify external policy and/or regulation changes at the local, state, and federal level; as well as changes in land use, travel, and growth projections that require consideration.
- Evaluate current project and program cost estimates and the financial capacity of the sales tax revenue through 2041 to confirm Plan delivery.
- 3. Review M2 program and project elements to determine if there are performance issues or constraints to the promised delivery.
- 4. Assess public and stakeholder support for the Plan priorities and the Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA) approach.
- 5. Identify OCTA and local jurisdictions progress in implementing the Plan.
