The City of Fullerton and the Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA) are progressing with construction of the Raymond Avenue undercrossing in Fullerton. Once complete, the bridge will separate vehicle traffic from train traffic by lowering the roadway beneath the railroad crossing, enhancing safety and boosting mobility.

As part of the Raymond Avenue undercrossing, installation of a temporary bypass railroad track along the BNSF Railway will require a full seven-day closure of Acacia Avenue just south of Walnut Avenue in Fullerton. This closure is scheduled to begin at 5 am June 9 through 5 am June 16, 2015. Please refer to the posted changeable message signs for the latest information on the closure dates.

Please refer to the map on the back of this notice for the designated detour route during this closure. **Residential and business** access will be maintained.

In addition, a full closure at Valencia Drive just east of Raymond Avenue began in May 2015 and will be in place for approximately 18 months. We apologize for any inconvenience these activities may cause.

Drivers and pedestrians are asked to use caution when traveling through the area. The Orange County Transportation Authority's highest priority is safety for its project workers and the public. During construction, please:

- Slow down and watch for workers and equipment
- Allow extra time to get to work, school and appointments
- Be extra careful when driving at night and in rainy weather
- Avoid use of mobile phones or other distractions
- Watch for closures and follow detours
- Be patient. Remember that this is a short-term inconvenience for a long-term traffic solution.
