The Orange County Transportation Authority has begun construction of the Placentia Avenue and Kraemer Boulevard undercrossings. In accordance with federal railroad safety regulations, residents should expect to hear an increase in the frequency of train horns because of construction activities on and around the railroad tracks, regardless of quiet zone designation.

Regular work hours are Monday through Saturday, 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.

The following construction activities are anticipated to begin during the next two weeks:

Placentia Avenue

- Install shoring for bridge, pump station and retaining wall construction
- Miscellaneous demolition and removals, and install waterline improvements along Fender Avenue
- Install and test remaining portion of temporary waterline along west side of Placentia Avenue; connect temporary waterline to permanent waterlines at Crowther Avenue / Placentia Avenue and Fender Avenue
- Remove abandoned / conflicting portion of waterline on Fender Avenue
- Excavate portion of Placentia Avenue for shoring, pump station, and bridge construction

Kraemer Boulevard

- Begin installation of footing for piles at retaining wall 1
- Continue installation of retaining wall 1 and 2 CIDH/Secant piles
- Continue placement of temporary shoring for bridge construction
- Install reinforced concrete box (RCB) north of shoofly tracks
- Continue to set form, reinforcing and pour radius box storm drain

Orangethorpe Avenue

- Pre-construction utility relocations continue

Tustin Avenue/Rose Drive

- Gas company relocations continue at Rose Drive and Orangethorpe Avenue intersection
- Demolition of "Currie Enterprises" building will begin. First phase will remove interior fixtures

Lakeview

- Right-of-way phase continues with property appraisals and evaluations
