The Orange County Transportation Authority has begun construction of the Placentia Avenue and Kraemer Boulevard undercrossings. In accordance with federal railroad safety regulations, residents should expect to hear an increase in the frequency of train horns because of construction activities on and around the railroad tracks, regardless of quiet zone designation.

Regular work hours are Monday through Saturday, 7 a.m. to 8 p.m.

The following construction activities are anticipated to begin during the next two weeks:

Placentia Avenue Undercrossing

- Continue work at Placentia / Crowther intersection (storm drain, electrical conduits for signals, water)
- Night time closures of Placentia / Crowther intersection ongoing to facilitate utility work
- Grading and paving at Home Depot Way
- Clearing and grubbing at Fender Avenue

Kraemer Boulevard Undercrossing

- Preparation of sub-grade and sub-ballast for BNSF track installation ongoing
- Sewer at Cardinal Street ongoing

Orangethorpe Avenue

- Demolition of buildings at Chapman and Orangethorpe Avenue to begin next week
- Utility relocations ongoing along Orangethorpe at Lakeside Plaza

Tustin Avenue/Rose Drive

- Removal of coaches at Del Cerro Mobile Estates to begin Monday, August 13, 2012. Coaches will be disconnected from utilities and removed from the park

BNSF Activity

BNSF is responsible for construction activities related to the installation of tracks necessary for the shoofly (railroad detour). OCTA and BNSF are closely coordinating their construction activities; however, **OCTA cannot direct the time and duration of BNSF activities. Track installation activities will be loud** and, depending on your location, you may experience additional vibration from the machinery. In addition to the track installation activities to shift rail traffic to accommodate the building of the rail bridges at Placentia Avenue and Kraemer Boulevard, BNSF is conducting track maintenance work along this corridor.

BNSF is scheduled to tie-in the new shoofly track to the main line track between now and mid-September.
