

#### Project Alignment



#### **PE ROW**

- Dedicated ROW owned by OCTA
- Double-Track, Ties and Ballast
- Maintenance road beside track
- Center Platforms
- Two-Wire OCS

#### STREET RUNNING

- One-way couplet downtown
  - 4<sup>th</sup> Street Eastbound, Santa Ana Blvd. Westbound
- Track on Ross and Crossover on Minter to bypass 4th Street
- Embedded Track (Block Rail)
- Side Platforms (except SARTC)
- Bike Lane Santa Ana Blvd. from French to Raitt
- One-Wire OCS
- 4<sup>th</sup> Street Diagonal Parking on south side changed to parallel



#### Schedule Update

- Several issues impacted project schedule
  - Executed Full Funding Grant Agreement (FFGA)
    - Target by October 2018
  - Construction bid opening
    - June 19, 2018, three months later than planned
  - Construction duration
    - Added six months to construction time to address bidders' requests
- Revised Revenue Service Date was September 2021
  - Assumed FFGA is executed in August 2018

#### Construction Bid

- Scope
  - 4.15-route-mile (8.3-track-mile) modern streetcar line with complex and specialized work for several elements:
    - Track in streets and PE ROW
    - Overhead electrical power supply and traction power substations
    - Stops with shelter canopies
    - Two bridges
    - Maintenance and storage facility
- Bids opened on June 19<sup>th</sup>
- 4 bids received; all over Engineer's Estimate
- Bid responsiveness review ongoing



#### New Starts Funding Status

- Discretionary funding program with extensive oversight and approvals
- Funding application submitted to FTA in May 2017
- Current administration has not been advancing new funding agreements
- Extensive coordination underway with FTA Region and Headquarters
- Awaiting "green light" from FTA to process agreement
- Process typically takes 4-6 months for administrative and Congressional approvals
- Schedule implication
  - Cannot issue Construction Contract LNTP until Full Funding Grant Agreement (FFGA) is executed

#### Vehicle Contract

- Executed contract with Siemens Industries: July 31, 2018
- Initial tasks:
  - Concurrence on vehicle design branding (4 exterior colors)
  - Approval of submissions
    - Schedule, project management and quality plans
  - Design review process





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#### Vehicle and Stop Branding

- OCTA created design and paint scheme for vehicles and stops to ensure brand consistency
- Development Process:
  - Consistency with OCTA Branding
  - Peer Review
  - Technical/Maintenance
  - Design Considerations
- Board to review initial concepts & approve for public release in August
- Outreach in August/September
- Board approval in November
