#### **Call to Order and Introductions**

Steering Committee Chair Navarrete called the November 10, 2016, regular meeting of the Orange County Taxi Administration Program (OCTAP) Steering Committee and Safety Committee to order.

Steering Committee Chair Navarrete reminded the members of the public that they may address the committees concerning any item on the agenda by completing a request to speak card or by raising their hand to be acknowledged and that all public comments should be kept under three minutes in length.

A motion to approve the consent calendar Items 1 and 2 was made by Committee Member Slagle (Large Taxicab Company Representative) and seconded by Committee Member Palacio (City of Costa Mesa). The motion passed unanimously.

#### Regular Calendar

#### 3. Future of Taxi Administration in Orange County

OCTA Government Relations representative Dave Simpson reminded members of the funding shortfall, and that OCTA issued a 12-month notice to the cities to withdraw as the Administrator of the OCTAP program effective June 30, 2016 unless other mutually acceptable arrangements are made for OCTA to continue as the Administrator of the OCTAP program.

Members of the Orange County City Managers Association sub-committee reported that they had been in limbo for several months, anticipating a State solution to the current state mandate for city regulation of taxi services. They encouraged Steering and Safety Committee members to provide their respective city managers with information about the Regulations and services provided by OCTAP in order to craft solutions that can be presented to their city councils. Members of the sub-committee suggested that they believed OCTA might have sufficient reserve funds to be able to continue as the administrator for another year, and asked OCTAP to review its annual budget to find possible reductions.

Director of Maintenance and Motorist Services Sue Zuhlke reminded the committees that measures to reduce the OCTAP budget have been on-going. Administrative costs were reduced by \$55,000 and the fiscal year 2016-2017 budget is \$116,000 less than the prior year. The potential exists to get through one more year with the existing reserves, barring unforeseen liabilities and revenue reductions. She also presented taxi trip origin and destination city data provided by the three largest taxi operators in the county; information that was requested by one of the cities. The trip distribution results were very similar to the city population percentages used in the city contribution calculation to make up for revenue shortfalls provided to the City Managers subcommittee.

Steering Committee Chair Navarrete reminded the committee that there are significant burdens that taxi operators face in an environment where taxi operators are required to be permitted by each city. Committee Member Slagle (Large Taxicab Company Representative) expanded on the benefits of the OCTAP program in reducing duplicative efforts for permitting, and warned that unintended results of not maintaining effective permitting practices may include uninsured taxis, customer overcharging, lack of driver background checks, and the potential for lack of taxi service in parts of the county. He encouraged the preservation of a single local regulating agency for all of the Orange County cities, and the County of Orange.

Steering Committee Chair Navarrete urged all committee members to continue to communicate with their city managers regarding the importance of taxicab regulation within their city and the status of the OCTAP program.

Committee Member Slagle (Large Taxicab Company Representative) asked OCTAP to present the projected budget for fiscal year 2017-2018 at the January Steering and Safety Committee meeting. Committee Member Sarreshtedari (Small Taxicab Company Representative) requested a cost per vehicle breakdown, based upon the projected budget.

#### **Discussion Items**

#### 4. Legislation Updates

OCTAP Administrator Sandy Boyle provided a summary of the bills signed by the Governor related to for hire-passenger services.

AB 1289 (Cooper) requires TNCs to conduct criminal background checks to ensure no driver is a registered sex offender, has been convicted of a violent felony, or, within the previous seven years, has been convicted of any misdemeanor assault or battery, domestic violence, or driving under the influence offense.

AB 2687 (Katcho) commencing July 1, 2018, the blood alcohol concentration will be reduced from 0.08 percent to 0.04 percent when a passenger for hire is in the vehicle at the time of the offense.

AB 2763 (Gatto) expands eligible vehicles for TNC operations to include leased or rented for a term that does not exceed 30 days and defines TNC vehicles as personal as opposed to a commercial vehicle.

#### 5. OCTAP Staff Updates

OCTAP Administrator Sandy Boyle provided an information only update on newly permitted TNCs, Zum and See Jane Go.

#### 6. Committee Representative Reports

No Committee Representative Reports were given.

#### 7. Public Comments

Member of the public Dr. Zabler, representing Norton Medical Industries, reviewed national statistics related to random drug and alcohol testing programs in different industries, and encouraged the committee to work with their cities to require drug and alcohol testing for TNC drivers.

Member of the public Tim Conlon expressed his concern over the number of CABCO random taxi inspections conducted by OCTAP.

Steering Committee Chair Navarrete presented retired Committee Member Pam Gillis (City of Garden Grove) with a certificate of appreciation for her years of service and dedication to the OCTAP Steering and Safety Committee.

**Subject:** Taxicab Fare Study

Orange County Taxi Administration Program (OCTAP) Regulations require each member agency to accept the taxicab fare schedule approved by the OCTAP Steering Committee. The OCTAP Administrator conducts a regular study of comparable taxicab fares, along with Consumer Price Index (CPI) and other consumer data, and presents the findings and a recommendation to the OCTAP Steering Committee. The OCTAP Steering Committee may pursue changes to the approved taxicab fare structure, after conducting a public hearing. There have been six fare adjustments approved by the OCTAP Steering Committee since it was established in 1998.

#### **Discussion**

On July 7, 2011, the OCTAP Steering Committee approved a methodology for monitoring economic activity for considering taxicab fare increases. The methodology includes a review of CPI data, average fuel rate data, and neighboring market taxicab metered rates.

Metered rates establish the maximum fare a customer may be charged, and are programmed into OCTAP permitted vehicle taximeters. Taxicab companies and drivers must operate the taximeter every time they carry a passenger, but may offer discounts to the metered rate.

OCTAP meter rates, last modified on July 19, 2014, are as follows:

\$3.50 for the flag drop and first 1/5 mile \$0.55 for each 1/5 mile, after the first 1/5 mile (\$2.75 mile) \$32.00 per hour wait time (Approximately \$0.53 per minute)

A comparison to neighboring market taximeter rates is provided in Attachment A. The comparison shows that Orange County meter rates are slightly higher than the average for the flag drop, first mile, and wait time. Meter rates for additional miles are the same as the average of the comparison areas. Unlike most markets in the comparison, there is no airport surcharge in Orange County.

The CPI historical data contained in Attachment B does not indicate an increase significant enough to warrant a metered rate increase. Average fuel prices for 2016, as shown in Attachment C, continue to be below the average annual fuel cost since 2010.

#### **Recommendation**

OCTAP metered rates were last modified on July 19, 2014. The OCTAP Administrator recommends no change to the current approved taxicab fare rates.

Should the Steering Committee wish to consider a fare increase, a public hearing would need to be scheduled for the April 20, 2017, Steering Committee meeting.
