Chairman Shaw Announces 2019 Board Strategic Initiatives

Chairman Tim Shaw introduced the 2019 board initiatives that will help OCTA focus on delivering transportation solutions for all Orange County residents. The six initiatives outline specific projects that are targeted for completion by the end of the year.

The strategic initiatives and projects include:

• Deliver Capital Projects

Continue the reconstruction of I-405 bridges, begin I-5 construction between El Toro
Road and SR-73 and improve the Anaheim Canyon Metrolink Station

Champion Fiscal Responsibility

 Set priorities for 2020 State Transportation Improvement Program funds, award Measure M grants to improve local streets, synchronize signals and enhance water quality, and support state and federal Legislation in support of funding for transportation

• Develop State-of-the-Art Regional Transportation Plans

 Prepare an initial set of transit alternatives along the Bristol Street Corridor, initiate work on the South Orange County multimodal transportation plan, and deliver board updates on Measure M environmental programs and innovative transportation strategies and technologies

Strengthen Regional Partnerships

 Update the SR-91 Implementation Plan with the Riverside County Transportation Commission, work with LA Metro on an intercounty transit connections study and collaborate with Caltrans on freeway improvements

• Implement OC Bus 360° Vision and Offer Modern Transit Solutions

 Launch Bravo! 529 service, award the OC Streetcar operations and maintenance contract and deploy hydrogen fuel cell buses

Reinforce A Culture of Safety

 Monitor pilot programs to enhance coach operator safety, ensure safety of the traveling public and employees through the development of a Safety Management System, and reinforce the Safety value with ongoing employee training

Board Approves Issuing Bonds for I-405 Improvement Project

The OCTA board authorized the issuance of \$400 million in Measure M sales tax revenue bonds to help fund the I-405 Improvement Project.

OCTA has continued to advance Measure M projects through the adoption of early delivery plans through strategic financing. By 2041, OCTA plans to deliver \$13.1 billion of Measure M transportation improvements to Orange County. Measure M is the county's half-cent sales tax for transportation improvements, also known as OC Go.

The I-405 Improvement Project is OCTA's largest project with \$1.1 billion of Measure M funds programmed for the project. The project's current finance plan includes approximately \$900 million of bond proceeds from the sale of sales tax revenue bonds.

In addition to the issuance of bonds, the OCTA board also approved the refinance of \$43.5 million in sales tax revenue bonds to save the agency money.

OCTA staff is scheduled to meet with rating agencies on Jan. 29 to provide an update on OCTA and to discuss sales tax history and forecasts, in addition to the proposed financing.
