OCTA CEO Darrell Johnson unveiled his strategic initiatives for the year ahead, placing a high priority on creating services to meet community needs, delivering the promises of Measure M2 projects and ensuring sustainability of the transit system.

The initiatives and action plan directly support the values, vision and mission of OCTA's strategic plan, which was approved by the board of directors in 2011.

Johnson's vision calls for delivering programs that will improve the quality of life for all Orange County residents.



The initiatives also include:

- Integrating policies to facilitate regional connectivity
- Preserving and enhancing the public trust
- Modernizing access to transportation information
- Promoting environmentally friendly initiatives
- Expanding regional bicycle programs
- Demonstrating a safety-conscious culture

Capital Projects on Track throughout the County

OCTA's capital programs division presented its quarterly update on project delivery of ongoing freeway and rail projects throughout the county.

The capital programs division is responsible for delivering highway, rail, railroad grade separation projects and facility improvements from the environmental phase through construction completion.



The key milestones achieved during the second quarter include:

- A construction contract was awarded for the landscape replacement project on SR-91 from SR-55 to SR-241
- Design was completed for the I-5 widening project to add carpool lanes from Avenida Vista Hermosa to Avenida Pico
- Construction was completed on the expansion of the Laguna Niguel/Mission Viejo Metrolink Station surface parking

In 2014, 39 major project milestones are scheduled to be completed.
