The Orange County Transportation Authority has begun construction of the Placentia Avenue undercrossing. Although regular work hours are Monday through Saturday, 7 a.m. to 8 p.m., there are limited times when night work will be necessary.

Placentia Avenue Undercrossing

- Contractor continuing soldier pile wall preparation work within the BNSF corridor with drilling and setting beams
- Night work for soldier pile wall began March 19 and will continue for three weeks. Night drilling crew will utilize a portion of the cul-de-sac east of apartment complex for temporary beam storage and concrete/pump truck. Signs/cones will be placed to secure the staging area and they will be cleared at the end of each night shift.
- Survey, pothole and install sewer line north of BNSF tracks
- Verification/potholing of various utilities continues
- Sewer work in Crowther began March 12 and will continue through April
- Preparation for Storm Drain Protection Structure to begin next week.

Kraemer Boulevard Undercrossing

- Demo existing sidewalk curb and gutter completed
- Property wall removal to continue on SE quadrant (Lancaster & Radcliffe). Sound blanket installation began.
- Property wall removal on SW quadrant (Cardinal & Pheasant) delayed to resolve shoring design issue. Residents will receive 48-hour notification when work resumes.
- Grading for continuous railroad shoofly (detour) along BNSF is ongoing
- Demolition of loading zone near Melrose & BNSF corridor complete
