How to plan your trip



Here are a few tips that will make your ride on Metrolink Weekends trains more enjoyable.

1. For the most current schedule, visit www.octa.net/metrolink or www.metrolinkweekends.com or call 800-371-LINK (5465).
2. Find your station. For the stations nearest your home and destination, check the Metrolink System Map on pages 15 & 16.
3. Before you head to the train station, find out about OCTA local bus route connections and schedules to your final destination by visiting www.octa.net/tripplanner OR call 714-636-RIDE (7433). Use your Metrolink Weekends ticket to ride FREE on connecting local OCTA buses.
4. For FREE connecting transit outside Orange County, see “With Metrolink You’ve Got Connections” on pages 31 & 32 for a listing with telephone numbers.
5. Arrive at your station at least 15 minutes before departure.
6. Before you board the train, purchase your ticket from a TVM at any Metrolink station. Tickets aren’t sold on the train, so you must have a valid ticket before boarding. Please present your ticket to the fare inspector upon request.
7. Signage at the station will direct you to the right track for your train. To ensure that you board the correct train, look for the electronic sign in the window of each passenger car. This sign indicates the final station stop for that train. Make sure you also check which line (OC Line or IEOC Line) is the correct train to reach your station.

Ticket Purchase is Easy

Metrolink and Amtrak tickets are for sale from the self-service, automated ticket vending machines (TVM) at any Metrolink station. Here’s how you do it:

1. **Select origin and destination.**
Choose which station you are traveling from and the station you are traveling to.
2. **Select ticket type.**
TVMs offer a variety of ticket types. The one best suited for you depends on how often you plan to ride Metrolink. Choices include: one-way ticket, round-trip ticket, 10-trip ticket, monthly pass.
3. **Select number of tickets.**
TVMs allow you to purchase multiple tickets, including tickets for adults, children, seniors and persons with disabilities.
4. **Select payment option.**
TVMs accept Visa, MasterCard, Discover, American Express, debit cards and cash (no \$100 bills please).
5. **Swipe card or insert cash.**
If you pay by debit card, enter your PIN and press “Enter.” Take your ticket and receipt. Now you’re ready to ride!

New Ticketing Feature

Amtrak Pacific Surfliner® tickets can now be purchased from Metrolink ticket vending machines at all Metrolink stations systemwide. This joint ticketing capability allows Amtrak passengers the ability to buy tickets at unmanned stations and allows riders to buy a round trip ticket when traveling one direction on Amtrak with a reverse direction on Metrolink.

Save 25% on Weekend Tickets

With Metrolink Weekends fares, you’ll save 25% off the regular adult weekday ticket price (one-way and round-trip only) for travel on the OC and IEOC Lines. Youths (6-18), seniors (65 & over) and persons with disabilities continue to receive 50% off regular fare on weekends. Plus, save more money by eliminating the cost of gas and parking.

How much does it cost to ride Metrolink on weekends?

Bring the family along — up to three children ages 5 and under ride FREE with each fare-paying adult.

And great news for Metrolink monthly pass holders — they get to ride FREE on weekends when they take the train for travel between their origin station and selected destination during a calendar month.

A Note on Accessibility

Metrolink trains are fully accessible; each train car has a fully accessible restroom.

A personal care attendant rides free with a passenger who is disabled.

Service animals are always welcome onboard. Non-service animals are allowed but must be in an approved pet carrier.

Passengers requiring boarding assistance should wait at the top of the wheelchair access ramp located at the end of the station platform. With a 48-hour advance request, a Metrolink representative

can provide assistance at the station.

Please call 800-371-LINK (5465), or 800-698-4TDD (4833) for speech- and hearing-impaired customers. Fares for persons with disabilities are 50% off regular fares at all times. Please provide proof of eligibility to the fare inspector upon request.

Holders of Access Services, Inc. (ASI) ID cards and Los Angeles County Access Services can ride any Metrolink train at no cost.

California Surf Museum

The California Surf Museum was founded in February 1986. The museum first opened in Encinitas, relocated to Pacific Beach, then to a building (since demolished) at the head of the Oceanside Pier before settling into its current location.

Each year the California Surf Museum presents a unique standing display of surfing equipment and photographs. The exhibit may highlight a high-profile pioneering legend, a spectacular surf spot, surfboard styles and/or shapers, a special time in surfing history, or one of many cultural spin-offs this exciting lifestyle has fostered. The museum also has a small gift shop that retails surfing related merchandise. 20,000 people visit the museum annually.

Oceanside Museum of Art

Oceanside Museum of Art (OMA) is a cultural jewel located in downtown Oceanside with a view of the Pacific Ocean and the historic Oceanside Pier. The museum is housed in a classic Irving Gill designed building that represents the flavor of Southern California in the 1930s. Providing North San Diego County with a variety of programming that complements its progressive exhibition schedule, OMA presents five provocative exhibits each year.

Exhibitions are designed to showcase the finest art of regional and international artists. From classic landscape paintings to studio furniture, neon sculpture, art quilts and architectural glass, OMA's galleries feature an enlightening survey of contemporary art enriched by the cultures of the community. OMA galleries are redesigned for each exhibition, surprising visitors with a fresh, exciting visual transformation for every new exhibit.

Oceanside Fishing Pier and Beach

At 1,954 feet, the Oceanside Fishing Pier is the longest wooden fishing pier on the West Coast. Enjoy the five-minute walk to Ruby's Diner at the far end for a meal or drink. On a clear day you'll be able to see La Jolla, the Coronado Islands and Catalina Island. Along the way you'll notice the engraved names of local citizens who cared enough about the 1988 restoration to make a private donation.

No license is required to fish from the pier. (Check with the bait shop on the pier for details.)

Also enjoy Oceanside's wide, sandy beaches, some of the nicest in Southern California. Oceanside's beaches play host to many national and international surf contests.

Old Towne Plaza Historic District

The one-square-mile area surrounding the original Public Plaza at the intersection of Chapman and Glassell was signed onto the National Historic Register in 1997. Historic structures include St. John's Lutheran Church, and Watson's Food and Drug, a restaurant/drugstore that opened in 1900. Clustered near the famed traffic circle are more than 45 antique stores with furniture and collectibles.
