

OCTA Bikelink Program is Coming to Fullerton!



Want a fun and inexpensive way to travel around the city of Fullerton? Try BikeLink, OCTA's new bike share program. BikeLink will connect the Fullerton Metrolink station with downtown Fullerton, the college campuses and other key destinations.

Bike share systems are popping up across the United States, including New York, Chicago, and Washington D.C. The network of kiosks and shared public bikes provide a cost-effective and environmentally friendly transportation option that complements existing bus

and rail service. BikeLink makes it easy for you to complete the first or last part of your trip, or as an alternative to driving.

BikeLink Stations

Starting this fall, a network of kiosks and bikes will open throughout the city of Fullerton, giving you the ability to hop off the bus or train and enjoy the city of Fullerton by bike. BikeLink stations will be placed near where you live and close to where you want to go. This will include major transportation hubs, schools, housing complexes, and destination centers in the city of Fullerton. The kiosks will be solar powered and the bikes will have a front storage basket, self-generating LED lights, and reflective paint and tires for added safety if riding at night.

How It Works

For a minimal fee, you can purchase a 1-day or 7-day access pass from any of the user-friendly kiosks in the system. These access passes provide you with unlimited 30 minute check-outs throughout the day. Trips lasting longer than 30 minutes will incur overtime fees. If you're a frequent user of BikeLink, an annual pass is the most cost-effective way to use the system.

The Solar Decathlon Express Bus Route 686
 Ride on Route 686 for only \$2 per ride (all OCTA bus passes accepted) between the University of

California Irvine (UCI), the Irvine Spectrum and the main entrance to the Great Park on exhibit days, October 3-6 & 10-13. Route 686 connects with OCTA bus routes 59, 79, 86, 90, 175, 178, 213, and 473; UCI Anteater Express; and City of Irvine iShuttle routes C and D. Route 686 operates every 30 minutes from 10:00 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. This special bus service is made possible through a grant from the Mobile Source Air Pollution Reduction Review Committee (MSRC).

· Get There on Metrolink

On the weekends, take Metrolink. Go to the nearest Metrolink Station, buy your roundtrip Metrolink Weekend Day Pass for only \$10 at the ticket vending machine located on the station platform and follow the signs to the tracks for your train. Exit at the Irvine Station. Next, board the free Irvine Station shuttle to the Solar Decathlon and XPO.

· Irvine Station Shuttle

Catch the shuttle between Irvine Station and the main entrance to the Great Park on exhibit days, October 3-6 & 10-13 for \$1 a ride; FREE for Metrolink ticket holders. It operates every 30 minutes from 7:00 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. and every 15 minutes from 10:45 a.m. to 7:30 p.m. Metrolink riders: From the northbound platform (Track 1), board the shuttle by going through the gate to the Great Park grounds. From the southbound platform, first cross over the bridge, then go through the gate to the grounds.

Laguna Niguel/Mission Viejo Metrolink Station Improvements

Good news, Metrolink riders! OCTA is expanding parking capacity at the Laguna Niguel/Mission Viejo Metrolink Station with the construction of a 176-space parking lot just south of the existing station parking lot. This will bring the total number of spaces at the Laguna Niguel/Mission Viejo Metrolink station to 460.

The new parking lot is being built on OCTA-owned property and will be maintained by the cities of Laguna Niguel and Mission Viejo. The project is scheduled to be completed in October 2013.

In addition to the expanded parking lot, design plans have begun for adding Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliant ramps that will replace the elevators at the existing pedestrian underpass. The project may also include a restroom and vending machine area that will occupy the existing elevator rooms. Construction on this phase of the project is expected to begin in early 2015 and be completed in fall of 2015. The underpass will remain open during construction.
