travel across the Orange and Los Angeles county border on a daily basis using automobiles, buses, and trains?

The Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA) and the Los Angeles County Metropolitan Transportation Authority (METRO) recently joined together to conduct the OC/LA Intercounty Transportation Study. This landmark study will explore opportunities to improve travel between the two counties.

In the effort to jointly develop a plan for improving intercounty travel, the study will analyze bus, rail and vehicle traffic along the border between the two counties. The agencies will also be soliciting comments from the general public who regularly drive or use public transportation to travel between the counties.

In the spring of 2008, OCTA and Metro will host two public workshops to present some proposed alternatives derived from this collaborative effort. The alternatives could include multiple forms of transportation improvements from freeways and streets to buses and commuter rail. You will be notified of the upcoming workshops prior to both public meetings.
