# Significant Events

Sep 2001 OCTA Chairman Ward directs staff

to evaluate options on State Route

91 Freeway

Dec 2001 Board authorizes staff to enter into

acquisition of the 91 Express Lanes

contingent upon due diligence review

#### **Terms of the Deal**

- \$207.5 million purchase price
- Payment of \$72.5 million
- Assumption of \$135 million in taxable bonds
- Acquire all CPTC rights, interests, assets, and liabilities
- Dismissal of all pending litigation
- Retain previous operator



# **Congestion Management Policy**

- Adopted July 2003
- Includes "Three Ride Free" policy
- Volumes monitored on an hourly basis
- Policy establishes trigger points
- Policy includes Cost of Living Adjustment
- Notification given ten days prior to adjustments
- Revenue generated must be sufficient to meet debt service coverage ratio (1.3x coverage)



# **Debt Refinancing**

- Refinanced taxable bonds with tax-exempt bonds
- Issued variable and fixed rate bonds (variable bonds swapped to fixed)
- Achieved "A" category underlying ratings
- December 15, 2030 final maturity
- Saved approximately \$24 million in present value dollars



#### **AB 1010 Deal Points**

- Non-compete clause shall be eliminated
- Authority to charge tolls terminates upon repayment of OCTA bonds or on December 31, 2030, whichever is earlier
- OCTA cannot sell or assign interest in Franchise Agreement without statutory approval by Legislature
- Authority to extend 91 Express Lanes into Riverside County requires approval of Riverside County Board of Supervisors, Riverside County Transportation Commission, and the SR-91 Advisory Committee



#### **AB 1010 Deal Points**

- Net tolls restricted to use for transportation related to SR-91 between SR-55 and I-15, excluding other toll roads
- Prior to July 1, 2003, OCTA in consultation with Caltrans and Riverside County Transportation Commission must issue plan and proposed completion schedule for improvements on SR-91 between SR-55 and I-15
- OCTA must update plan annually



### **SR-91 Advisory Committee**

- AB 1010 required the establishment of the SR-91 Advisory Committee
- OCTA shares the SR-91 Advisory Committee costs with the Riverside County Transportation Commission
- Must include informational item for initial toll structure or any changes on a regularly scheduled SR-91 Advisory Committee agenda
- Conduct annual audit to review revenues and expenditures and provide to SR-91 Advisory Committee members



#### 2007 Environment

- 14.5 million annual vehicle trips
- 91 Express Lanes revenues used to improve general purpose lanes in the SR-91 corridor
- Renewed Measure M Extension passes earmarking \$925 million for SR-91 corridor
- Proposition 1B funds are projected to fund \$93 million in SR-91 improvements
- Riverside County Transportation Commission is looking to expand the 91 Express Lanes into Riverside County
