

- Irrigation piping & sprinklers

District 12 Landscape Inventory

- 2,990 acres of landscaping (11% of statewide inventory)
- 54,562 trees
- 1,341 palms
- 1,746 acres of ground cover



Inventory (continued)

- 410 linear miles of ground cover edging
- 4 landscaped park & ride lots
- 5,700 acres of roadsides not landscaped (require mowing and spraying)

• \$6.47M allocated for Landscape activities, including labor and operating expense

• \$6.6M (labor \$5.3M and operating expense \$1.3M)

Expenditure per acre for District 12


• \$6.6M/2,990 acres = \$2,207/ per acre

Level of Service Scores

- A measurement tool used by highway maintenance organizations throughout the nation
- Gives an indication of the condition of the element being reviewed
- Scores are used to help determine future allocations
- · Scoring is done once a year


District 12

Level of Service Scoring System


- Statewide targets the last 3 years were 54, 59 & 60
- District 12 targets were 69, 65 & 70
- District 12 achieved 74, 69 & 69
- 100-90 = A: not unsightly, not perfect
- 89-80 = B: good appearance, not great
- 79-70 = C: minimum acceptable
- 69-60 = D: below minimum acceptable
- less than 60 = fail: unacceptable







FY 2005/06
District 12 ranked third in the State



Projects

- Since 1998, over 1,200 acres of highway landscaping have been developed in Orange County
- 261 acres of landscape work are currently under construction or plant establishment.
- 110 acres of landscape work have been programmed for construction in the next 3 years.






AAH Campaign

- 24 times/Year in adopted areas
- 18,200 Bags (260 10yard dump trucks)
- A football field 14 inches high







Special Program People (SPP)

- County low risk offenders
- Groups of 10-15 people
- CT provides;
 - transportation
 - supervision
 - safety instruction





Special Program People

- 2800 potential trash pickup areas (40'x1/2 mile)
- 5-30 minutes average
- 3 times/year District wide
- 13,300 bags (190 10-yard dump trucks)
- · A football field 11 inches high

SPP work

- 10 SPP workers/day
- 8 times/month (SPP)
- 2 times/month (AAH)
- 150 bags/day









SPP Litter removal Two days later











District Coverage Area



- 6730 acres of unpaved areas (includes 3000ac landscape)
- Or 5177 football fields
- 2800 (40'x1/2 mile) potential sites



Graffiti Campaign

- One 2-person crew
- Cleared 1.2 M Sq. ft (28 miles of 8-foot high wall)







Road Patrol

- · Removed Traffic hazards
- 17,156 Vehicle-mile
- 60 times/year







Sweeping Campaign

- 10 times /year
- Covered 10,377 shoulder Lane-mile







Contract Trash Collection

• Contractors hauled 6000 Tons (450 - 6x20x8 Bins)





Trash Debris Task Force

- Caltrans coordinates with County team
- Provide public information
- Shares all anti-litter efforts with the team





Don't Trash California Campaign

- Public information outreach


Mercury NEWS "Trashed roads plague region" Sept. 12, 2005

Los Angeles was 10th, while San Diego and Orange Counties boast highways that are among the cleanest in the state."




What do you feel should be the three HIGHEST priority items for Caltrans Maintenace crews?
