Introduction

- The Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP) is the primary programming and implementation component for projects identified in the Regional Transportation Plan (RTP).
- The FTIP lists projects and identified funding sources for every transportation project that:
 - Receives Federal funds.
 - Receives State funds.
 - Regionally significant projects.



What is "Regionally Significant"?

What is considered a "regionally significant"project?

Projects that impact the

County and region, such as:

- Freeways/ Highways
- Expansions to Principal Arterial (8 lane)
- Expansions to Major Arterial (6 lane)
- Routes that provide access to regional shopping centers, airports, amusement parks, etc.
- Goods Movement
- Transit Centers, Rail Stations, Airports, Ports
- Fixed Transit Routes

Administrative Modifications

Includes changes:

- That do not affect the regional emissions analysis
- That do not affect the timely implementation of the Transportation Control Measures
- In fund source, fund changes, lead agency, minor project description, and split or combining projects
- In funding less than 40% or less than \$10 million of the total project cost or project phase

Formal Amendments

Includes:

- Any major change to the project that can not be made through an administrative modification
- Any change that may require new conformity determination
- Cost increases over 40% or \$10 million or more of the total project cost or project phase

The 2019 FTIP period covers a six-year period from FFY18/19 to FFY23/24. Projects listed in the last two years will be considered informational consistent with federal regulations.

2019 FTIP- Additional Provisions

Projects must:

- Be fully funded.
 - Includes approved funds only (back-up documentation)
- Comply with the Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG) longrange RTP.



Major Changes from previous FTIP cycles

- Active Transportation
 - Non-motorized transportation projects or projects that include/improve non-motorized transportation must use program codes (page 13 of Guidebook).
 - FTIP is required for the obligation of funds(E-76)
- 40% and \$10 million thresholds for amendments are being enforced by project total cost and for project phase



Major Changes from previous FTIP guidelines

- Guidelines have been updated to reflect new information for Fixing America's Surface Transportation Act and SB1 Road Repair and Accountability Act
- Additional Information on Performance Measures and Implementation Schedule are provided

Local Agencies

 Orange County Transportation Authority (OCTA)

 Southern California Association of Governments (SCAG)



Roles and Responsibilities

Local Agencies

- Submit projects that are required in the FTIP.
- -Add new projects
- -Delete existing projects
- -Modify existing projects
- -Carry over active projects
- Ensure projects comply with FTIP guidelines.
- Ensure projects comply with Transportation Control Measure (TCM) requirements.
- Ensure projects are fully funded.
- Provide backup documentation authorizing funding for projects.

OCTA

- Administers the FTIP in Orange County.
- Programs OCTA related projects into the FTIP.
- Reviews projects submitted from local agencies for FTIP and RTP compliance.
- Prepares final submittal to SCAG
- Prepares group project listings for:
 - -Regional Active Transportation Program (ATP)
 - -Arterial Pavement Management Program (APM)
 - -Bicycle Corridor Improvement Program (BCIP)
 - -Highway Bridge Program (HBP)

SCAG

- Maintains the regional FTIP database.
- Reviews projects for FTIP compliance.
- Submits projects to
 Caltrans and Federal
 Highways Administration
 (FHWA) / Federal Transit
 Administration (FTA) for
 review.
- Prepares group project listings for:
 - -Statewide ATP
 - -Highway Safety Improvement Program (HSIP)
 - -Safe-Routes to School (SRTS/SR2S)

2019 FTIP

shopping centers, airports, amusement parks, etc.

- · Goods Movement
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 Cost increases over 40% or \$10 million or more of the total project cost or project phase

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Because only the first four years of the program are financially constrained, the FTIP is updated every two years.

Base FTIP Adoption Submittal Carry Over Projects

 Active projects always need to be officially carried over from the outgoing FTIP cycle to the new FTIP cycle

- Allows agencies to move projects from an outgoing FTIP cycle to a new FTIP adoption
- 2017 FTIP to 2019 FTIP



Base FTIP Adoption Submittal Required Resolution

 Agency's City Council or Board is required to approve a resolution regarding local agency FTIP base submittal.



Sample Resolution

RESOL	.UTION NO	

A RESOLUTION OF THE (CITY) WHICH CERTIFIES THAT (CITY) HAS THE RESOURCES TO FUND THE PROJECTS IN THE FFY 2018/19 – 2023/24 TRANSPORTATION IMPROVEMENT PROGRAM AND AFFIRMS ITS COMMITMENT TO IMPLEMENT ALL PROJECTS IN THE PROGRAM

WHEREAS, [CITY] (CITY) is located within the metropolitan planning boundaries of the Southern California Association of Governments; and

WHEREAS, [CITY] City Council has authorized projects submittals to Orange County Transportation Authority's (OCTA) Federal Transportation Improvement Program (FTIP); and

WHEREAS, CITY is the lead agency for projects and will comply with applicable local, state, and federal provisions including but not limited to the Federal Transportation Improvement Program, California Environmental Quality Act, National Environmental Policy Act, Americans with Disabilities Act, and Buy America; and

WHEREAS, CITY agrees to construct Transportation Control Measures projects as noted in the amendments in a timely manner.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, by the City Council of the City of [CITY], does hereby affirm the City's commitment to the projects submitted in the 2019 Federal Transportation Improvement Program.



Base FTIP Submittal

Local Agency submits projects to OCTA



OCTA reviews projects and submits to SCAG for evaluation



SCAG analyzes submitted programs/ modeling activity



Adopted FTIP due to federal agencies



FTIP adopted at the state level



30 day public review period and public hearings



Monthly Amendment Process *Modifying Projects in the FTIP*

Following the initial base FTIP submittal, projects do not need to be included in the monthly amendment process if there are no changes.

When necessary, there are two types of changes that can be made:

- Administrative Modification
- Formal Amendment

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Amending & Modifying FTIP Projects- Administrative Modifications

Local Agency submits projects and to OCTA to OCTA

OCTA reviews projects and submits to SCAG

SCAG reviews projects and approves

- Each administrative modification does not require a public hearing or review.
- There is no federal approval process. FHWA and FTA receive the administrative modifications for informational purposes.

Local Agency submits projects to OCTA



OCTA reviews projects and submits to SCAG



SCAG reviews projects and submits for 15 day public review



FHWA/FTA approves the amendment and notifies Caltrans and SCAG



Caltrans approves the amendment



SCAG submits to Caltrans



Amending & Modifying FTIP Projects

FTIP Amendment Turn Around

Amendment Category	Public Review	Estimated Approval (+/-)
Administrative Modification	N/A	45 days
Formal Amendment	Minimum 15 days	90 days
