



SR-241 to SR-91 Eastbound Merge Lane NOW OPEN!

On the morning of May 6, crews opened the new SR-241/SR-91 eastbound merge lane to drivers following overnight re-striping operations. The newly reconstructed lane and shoulder area is now 12 feet wide and extends from the NB SR-241/EB SR-91 interchange to Coal Canyon Road. In addition to lane work, construction crews have also relocated utilities and installed safety rails along this segment of the freeway project.

Nighttime/Off-Peak Closure for Re-Striping; Safe and Easy Detour in Place

To complete re-striping of all lanes between SR-241/SR-91 interchange and Coal Canyon Road, crews will conduct alternating lane and connector closures Thursday, May 6 between 10 p.m. and 5 a.m. nightly. A safe and easy detour will be in place.



About the SR-91 Eastbound Lane Addition Project

Funded by the American Recovery and Reinvestment Act of 2009, the SR-91 Eastbound Lane Addition Project will deliver a new, nearly 6-mile lane along a key stretch of the SR-91. When completed, commuters will be able to travel directly from the SR-241 to the SR-71, or exit in between, without changing lanes. Additionally, all lanes and shoulder areas in the project area will be expanded to 12 feet, improving driving conditions and optimizing freeway operations. Five bridges and 12 retaining walls will also be built. The project will be completed at the end of 2010.
