

E-bike Safety Action Plan



Project Overview

- Identify gaps and needs in outreach, education, encouragement, data, and funding for e-bike safety.
- Conduct e-bike rodeo/education events.
- Partner with stakeholders to identify potential areas of concern.
- Strengthen countywide efforts to improve safe e-bike use.
- Identify funding opportunities.
- Develop an Action Plan.



Stakeholder Engagement

- Stakeholder Committee includes OCTA, the County of Orange, OC Parks, cities, schools, community members, and other stakeholders.
- The Stakeholder Committee will meet five (5) times during the project.
 - First meeting September 24th
- Provides guidance and feedback to project team and discuss e-bike best practices.
- Stakeholder survey solicits feedback from a broader group on local e-bike safety needs and efforts.



Community Engagement

- Presentations, virtual open houses, pop-up events, and e-bike rodeos.
 - Solicit feedback
 - Deliver safety and skills events
 - Promote safe and responsible use of e-bikes
- E-bike rodeos providing e-bike instruction while building momentum for safe e-bike use and soliciting community input.

E-bike Resource Evaluation

- Identify resources to facilitate safe e-bike operations.
- Identify where resources either don't exist or fall short of current needs.
 - Conducting interviews
 - Data source inventory
 - Non-infrastructure inventory



Gap Analysis and Strategy Development

- Conduct a gap analysis, develop implementation strategies and a toolkit facilitating safe e-bike use.
 - Describe the current state of e-bike safety efforts.
 - Recommend approach for e-bike safety efforts where there are none.
 - Identifying specific actions that could be taken by stakeholders.
- Final report
 - Summarize results, recommendations, action items, roles and responsibilities.
 - Distributed to the Stakeholder Committee and posted for public review on the OCTA website.
