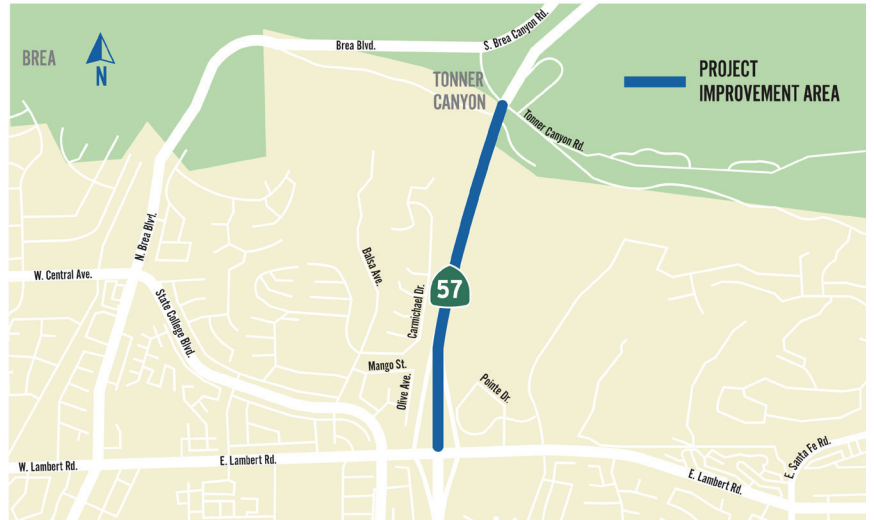
PROJECT OVERVIEW

The Orange Freeway (SR-57) from Lambert Road to Tonner Canyon Road is an important truck route and an integral part of Southern California's freeway network. This project requires coordination between OCTA and Los Angeles Metro, two Caltrans Districts (7 and 12) and the cities in the project area, to study the addition of a truck climbing lane to enhance freeway operations and improve regional circulation of goods and services along this segment of northbound SR-57.

This project is funded by OC Go (also known as Measure M), a 30-year half-cent sales tax for transportation improvements in Orange County through 2041. After experiencing the success and progress of M1, nearly 70% of Orange County voters renewed the half-cent sales tax for transportation improvements to launch OC Go in 2011.

PROPOSED NORTHBOUND IMPROVEMENTS

- A northbound truck climbing lane on SR-57 from Lambert Road to Tonner Canyon Road
- Improve traffic flow and increase throughput overall
- This project is projected to begin in summer 2020
