


Rail in Orange County

- OCTA owns 48 miles
- Majority double track
- Passenger service:
 - Amtrak Pacific Surfliner:22 daily trains
 - Metrolink: 3 lines, 54 daily trains, 11 stations
- Freight service:
 - BNSF Railway
 - Union Pacific
 - 4-6 trains per day




Future Conditions



Measure M

- Half-cent transportation sales tax
- Passed in 1990 for 20 years
- Renewed in 2006 for 30 years
 - \$15.8 billion





Project S - Transit Extensions



- Project S of Measure M includes \$1.2 billion for Transit Extensions to Metrolink, including rubber-tire and fixed-guideways
- Approximately \$29 million allocated for planning/project development of two fixed guideway projects in Anaheim and Santa Ana/Garden Grove







Planning Approach



- Bottoms- up planning approach
- Cities of Santa Ana and Garden Grove lead for planning, selection of locally preferred alternative and environmental clearance
- OCTA served in an oversight capacity
- Project developed consistent with FTA New Starts requirements






- Improve transit accessibility & mobility

OCTA Board Policy Decisions



- OCTA to serve as the lead agency for project development, implementation, operations and maintenance.
- Develop cooperative agreement with Santa Ana and Garden Grove to define roles and responsibilities for project development through construction.
- Pursue federal funding and request entrance into project development from the FTA.
- Approve use of Measure M2 Project S revenues to fund operations and maintenance.
- Award contract to HDR Engineering for PMC of Streetcar.


