#### 1. Welcome

Chair Mary Anne Skorpanich welcomed everyone to the meeting.

### 2. Approval of the July 9, 2015 Meeting Minutes

Approval of the July 9, 2015 meeting minutes was tabled until the next ECAC meeting due to lack of a quorum.

## 3 Measure M2 10-Year Review Presentation

Tamara Warren, Manager of the Measure M Planning office, gave a presentation on the Measure M2 10-Year Review. The M2 Ordinance No.3 requires that a review of the program take place at least every ten years. The 10-Year Review is currently underway and OCTA would like to share the progress of M2 and seek the committee's input on the overall M2 program.

Marissa Espino went over the Measure M Ten-Year Review Questionnaire with the ECAC members and told them of other ways they could give input on the Measure M program.

The ECAC responded with the following when asked for input on the Program:

- Keep up to date on technology developments.
- Keep up to date on policy changes in Sacramento.
- Keep up to date on which way development is going.
- Utilize what they already have for clean-up or retention basins.
- Be very specific informing voters "here is what we have done and here is what we promised."
- More places to meet and have conferences around train stations.

## 4 Tier 2 Planning Study Update Presentation

Ken Susilo, from Geosyntec, gave a background report on how the Tier 2 Planning Study was developed and how the funded projects align with the water quality needs as presented in the Planning Study.

Chair Mary Anne Skorpanich said since they have one Storm Water Permit and another on the way, a plan that shows how we are going to meet water quality standards needs to be developed. It is important that this plan establish a timeline and specify project locations. Committing to this plan, which is likely to be approved in two or three years, will generate a great deal of interest in the next big wave of projects.

Chair Mary Anne Skorpanich suggested delaying the third call for projects until more of the plans are fleshed out and the cities have a better idea of what needs to be done.

Mark Tettemer asked where the finish line would be. Garry Brown said there has to be something on the ground at some point of time that shows the benefit. Mark Tettemer said then there needs to be a definition of "finish line." The cities need to know where to aim at.
