Board Sets Transportation Vision for 2023

OCTA Chairman Gene Hernandez, also the Mayor of Yorba Linda, and OCTA CEO Darrell E. Johnson unveiled the 2023 Board and CEO Strategic Initiatives and Action Plan that will guide the agency through the year while remaining fiscally conservative and working to provide a balanced, sustainable transportation system for Orange County.

For 2023, there are three Board initiatives that are supported by nine CEO Initiatives:

OC Streetcar Construction 78% Complete

OCTA's board received a quarterly update on the OC Streetcar, which is now 78% complete.

The OC Streetcar will be Orange County's first modern electric streetcar, running along a 4.1-mile route between the Santa Ana Regional Transportation Center and Harbor Boulevard in Garden Grove. The project will improve transit connectivity and accessibility, increase transit options, relieve congestion, and provide benefits to the community and traveling public.

The OC Streetcar will offer an additional affordable and convenient transit option, connecting with several of the busiest OC Bus routes and Metrolink commuter rail, in one of the nation's most densely populated areas, while producing zero emissions.

Recent progress on the OC Streetcar includes:

- The installation of embedded track on Fourth Street was completed
- Both directions of street traffic reopened between French Street and Ross Street ahead of the Thanksgiving milestone date
- The first platform canopy was installed near French Street
- Seven streetcar vehicles are in the final stages of manufacturing and the eighth vehicle is in final assembly and will commence static and dynamic testing in early 2023
- Significant outreach efforts continued, including bilingual construction notices, business outreach, and the Downtown Santa Ana Eat, Shop, Play Program
