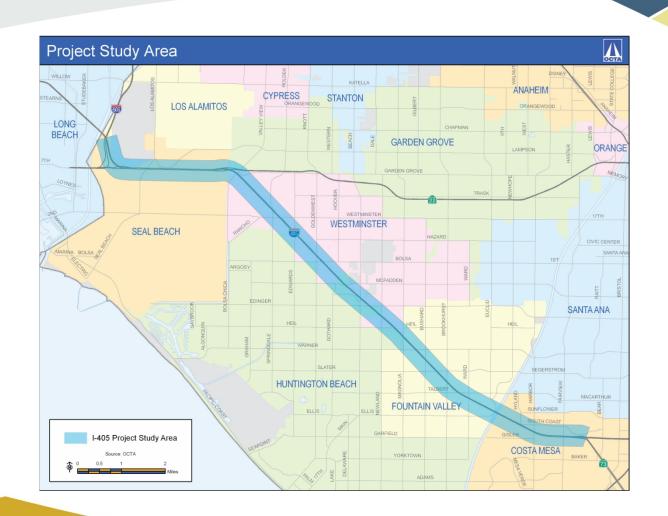

Project Alternatives in the EIR/EIS

- No Build Alternative
- **Alternative 1:** Adds one general purpose lane in each direction
- Alternative 2: Adds two general purpose lanes in each direction
- Alternative 3: Adds one toll lane to the existing carpool lane in each direction that will be managed together.* The alternative also adds a general purpose lane in each direction north of Euclid Street to I-605
- Alternative 4: Provides an additional general purpose lane at various locations and improves various interchanges from Euclid Street to I-605
- The Transportation Systems Management (TSM)/Transportation Demand Management (TDM)/ Mass Transit Alternative: Involves low-cost operational improvements, rather than major capital projects

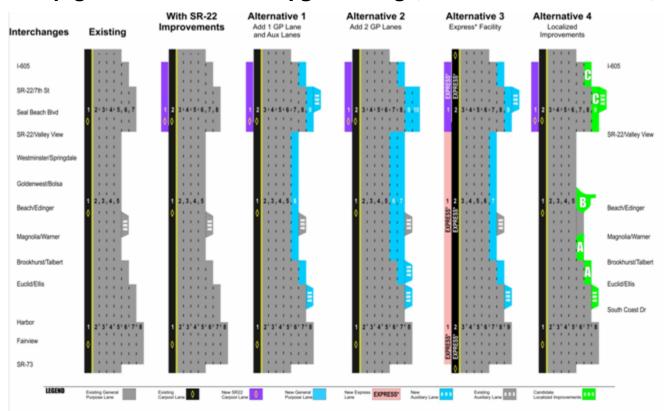

Current and Projected Traffic

- Current volume: 300,000 vehicles per day
- 2035 forecast: 370,000 vehicles per day



If built for demand – up to 20 lanes needed

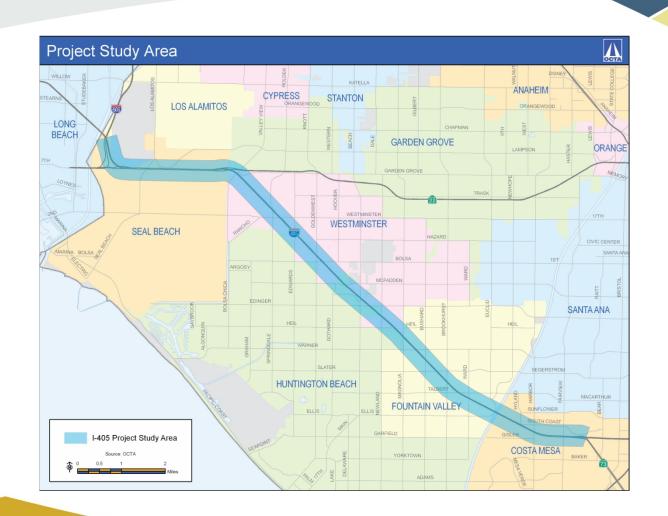








Interstate 405 Project Location

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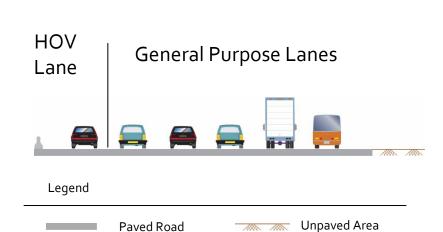

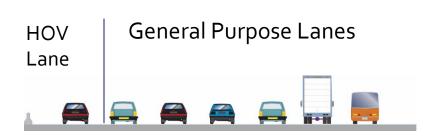

Legend Paved Road Unpaved Area











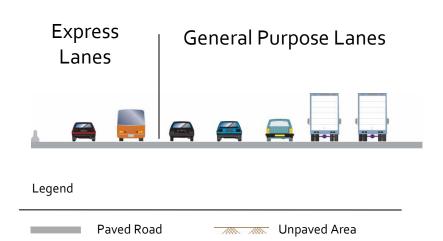

Revenue

- Renewed Measure M (M2): \$300 million
 - To add one lane to I-405
 - Based on Major Investment Study planning level estimate
 - Mainline only, without interchange improvements







Cost

- Alternatives 1 & 2 \$1.2 to 1.7 billion
- Alternative 3 \$1.7 billion+
- Alternative 4 Limit improvements to available M2 funds (\$300 million)







Origins of Alternatives

- Alternative 1: One new General Purpose (GP) Lane
 - Included in 2006 Major Investment Study (MIS)
 - OCTA's Locally Preferred Strategy
- Alternative 2: Two new GP Lanes
 - Included in 2008 Caltrans Project Study Report
- Alternative 3: One new GP lane and two new express lanes to accommodate existing HOV operation and provide additional capacity for **HOT** usage
 - Added by OCTA Board of Directors in January 2009
- Alternative 4: Provides an additional general purpose lane at various locations and improves various interchanges
 - Added by OCTA Board of Directors in January 2009









^{*} All alternatives will add new lanes while minimizing right of way impacts.

Steps to Minimize Right-of-Way Impacts

- Design to standards and consider:
 - Building to the right-of-way line
 - Only building required auxiliary lanes
 - Reducing carpool lane buffer
 - Moving the centerline of the freeway
- Adjust design and seek possible exceptions to standards to:
 - Reduce shoulder width
 - Reduce carpool lane width
 - Reduce general purpose lane width
